Dear Sir,

In connection with the recent disturbances in Dublin, I wish to bring the following case under your notice with a view, if possible of obtaining some compensation for losses sustained as a result thereof.

Previous to the outbreak of the Rebellion I carried on business at the above address as Bootmaker & Repairer, but owing to incessant rifle fire etc., I was obliged to vacate my premises and seek shelter elsewhere.

During my absence the Military took possession of my shop and used same as a Mess Room, they, having to effect a forcible entry and upon my return and taking a list of my stock the following deficiencies and damage were found to exist viz:-
