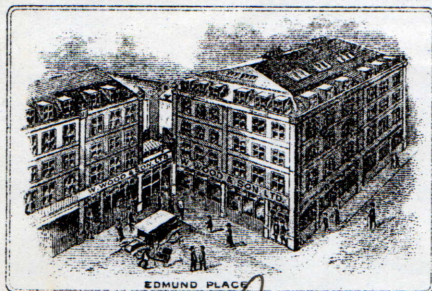

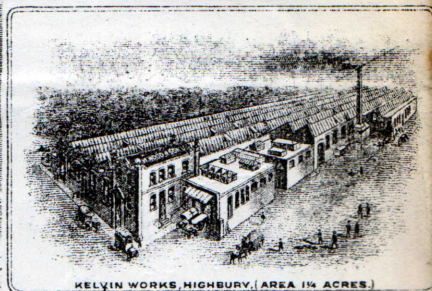

Dear Sir,

I am in receipt of your letter of the 7th., Inst. with inclosures and herewith send you the original invoices for the goods destroyed by fire in your office.

These goods were not billed to the government at your selling price but at the absolute cost to the manufacturer, as you will see by the account I now render.

They are billed as pairs as the single boots are of absolutely no value, it would be impossible to match the weights of leather or the colors of Tans and Fancy leathers, no factory would undertake to do this.

There were not 36 prs. of boots for Messrs. Hartford & McDonald in your office but 35 prs., these I had charged in at the factory price.

In figuring up the average cost of these goods for the claim you first submitted, I omitted the cost of freight which amounts to £13-5-9 and certainly should be included as it is part of the cost of the shoes.

We had no insurance whatever covering these goods.

As regards the claim for the four traveling cases, I haven't the receipts for these but they cost about three times the amount you valued them at.
