We herewith enclose Claims numbered 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6. With reference to No. 1, these goods were looted from the Stores of Messrs. Tedcastle McCormick and Co. and Messrs. Findlater are only insured from the time the goods reach their own stores,

As to No. 2, these goods were looted from the British and Irish Steam Packet Co's Stores.

As to No. 3 these goods were looted from the British and Irish Steam Packet Co's Stores also.

As to No. 4 these goods were destroyed in the Garrison Institute Middle Abbey Street, this Institute is carried on for charitable purposes and the goods were handed to Garrison Sergeant Major Duell on behalf of the Committee by ^{our clients} ~~my Company~~ from time to time on the understanding that if they did not sell them they could return them. They would not therefore, be covered by Messrs. Findlater's Insurance and it is understood that the Committee of the Garrison Institute have no Policy.

As to No. 5 This claim is for Window Glass and goods looted from 27 to 32 Upper Sackville Street.

On the 11th August, we sent you a claim on behalf of the Committee of the above Lunatic for damage done to 2 Lansdowne Road, which we understand your Committee is dealing with.

During the Rebellion the Military took from the House 2 Lansdowne Road a very valuable double barrel shot gun in case, by Messrs. Rigby of Dublin. By the directions of the Lord Chancellor we communicated with the Authorities who have been making a search with a view to recovering and returning the gun.

We now understand from them that they have been unable to find it and are informed that we should make a claim for its value to your Committee.


We are instructed to make a claim on behalf of Mr.


