Sir,

My client Mr I. Green of 109 Lr Gardiner Street, General Dealer & Contractor, informs me that during the recent disturbances the military authorities requisitioned his premises at 109 Lr Gardiner Street for the purpose of using it as a depot for prisoners and wounded. He further states that they removed for military purposes the articles set out in the list attached hereto; the values of which are placed opposite each article.

As far as he knows the place was in military possession for five days, and he is informed that they left the place open when leaving with the result that the premises were ransacked by looters.

Under the circumstances I think that my client is entitled to compensation, and I would be obliged if you would bring the matter under the notice of the proper authorities.
