I have now completed my investigations herein. I have perused the correspondence and have had several interviews with the Claimant. I have carefully inspected the damage. I attach Brooks Thomas' A/c Interests in the buildings shewing that the net cost of the Glass was only £10.9.10. and not £12. All the Stock-in-trade was claimed for at retail prices and this I have adjusted. The estimate from Cochrane for the Doors is absurd and my valuation fully covers the loss. The building is held covered by the North British & Mercantile Insurance Co. and this I have verified. The Policy is at present in force.

Payment recommended £66.19.7.

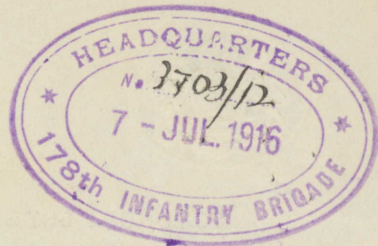

Reference Min: 1. The Bn under my Command was on duty in Samell Street on the date in question. I cannot remember the N<sup>o</sup>'s of houses actually occupied—those at the corners of the different streets in my area—but I believe N<sup>o</sup>. 50 was opposite to the house I used as my orderly room, & if so I cleared the Mall out, after a man had been <sup>in it</sup> wounded. The Lucan part was locked up <sup>my adjutant</sup> and kept the keys until the following Monday when he handed them over to the R.I.C. who took the situation over from me. My adjutant (Capt Langford) is prepared to swear on oath that nothing was taken during the time he held the keys.

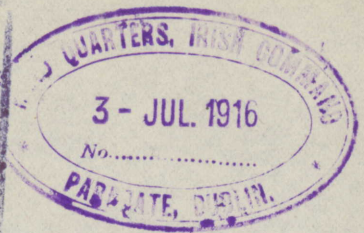
