Situation of Property Horse shot outside the schools, Northumberland Rd. Dublin

Interests in the buildings This horse bolted from his stables here of Beggar's Bush Barracks. The owner followed but was stopped by the military the horse coming under fire was shot. The date of the occurrence given by the owner must be wrong as the military were not in occupation of Northumberland Rd on 25th April. They were there on the evening of 26th April. The horse appears to have been buried in the schools ground. Claimant referred me to officials in the Pembroke U.D.C. who exhumed the horse. I interviewed Mr Brennan 3 Dodder View, Foreman. Brennan informed me he was present when horse was exhumed. He knew the animal well & identified it as it was often used in the P.U.D.C work. Brennan was able to give me the markings on horse. I also interviewed Mr Healy, Chief Sanitary Inspector 62 Sandford Rd. He identified Kennedy's horse when it was exhumed. With this evidence there is no doubt the horse was shot & I consider the animal was valued to £30.
