In reference to the sum of £120 awarded by the Property Losses Committee, in respect of injury to the above premises, we are instructed by our clients to point out that they submitted to your Committee estimates for the repairs to the damages caused during the Rebellion in April last, as distinct from that caused by ordinary wear and tear, amounting, in the case of 47 North King Street, to £205, and in the case of 48 & 49, North King Street, to £112, making together £317, in respect of which a payment of £120 only has been made, leaving a balance of £197. Our clients cannot regard the amount paid by your Committee as at all adequate, even on a pre-War cost basis, and we are therefore instructed to ask that your Committee will kindly reconsider this claim, as our clients believe that the amount awarded cannot have been intended to cover the cost of repairs to the three houses 47, 48, & 49, North King Street, and it is quite clear from the estimates that it would be impossible to make good the damage done during the Rebellion for the sum of £120 already awarded. Our clients further instruct us to request that you will be so good as to state how the amount of this






