

The roof and gutters are damaged also requiring repair. Locks and keys in entire house are smashed and will require to be replaced. The plastering to front of house done recently will require to be made good as it is greatly damaged by hullet marks. It will cost in all to cover expenses, etc. the sum of £19.0.0.
