We are obliged for your letter of the 30th ult., and note that the item of £160 in respect of book debts is inadmissible under the Committee's terms of reference, and that the claim of £9 for telephone instruments has also been disallowed as the claim will not be pressed by the Post Office. This leaves the deductions from our Clients claim (including the Gas Company's meter and apparatus) at the sum of £282. 17. 9 and in respect thereof our Clients have received a Draft for £217. 19. 0 purporting to be in full discharge. We should be obliged if you would kindly let us know :-

- (1) The other items disallowed.
- (2) Was the value of the Gas Company's meter and apparatus included in the Draft sent to our Clients?
- (3) Is it open to our Clients to accept the Draft sent as a payment on account and without prejudice?




