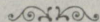


Dear Sir,

We propose to carry out the following work in restoring the Property injured during the Rebellion in connection with the Salvation Army Hall, Abbey Street, Dublin, for the sum of- FIFTEEN POUNDS STERLING. (£ 15. 0. 0).,

- (1) To take off and repair Door in Basement.
- (2) Refix Panic Bolt.
- (3) Provide and fix 6" Brass Barrel Bolt.
- (4) Supply and fix one new 4-pannelled Door.
- (5) Provide and fix two new 6/ Rim Locks and Furniture.
- (6) Cut out panel in Door and replace with new one.
- (7) Re-glaze broken glass with new Ribbed Glass.

Also the following repairs to the Electric Light Installation.

- A. Fit new globe similar to present globe lettered SALVATION ARMY in black letters, and supply and fit new metal filament lamp- Re plug for bracket.  
Steps to Basement
- B. Supply and fit one well glass and one metal filament lamp.
- C. Corner outside at Notice Board.

Supply and fit new well glass and one metal filament lamp.

D. Large Room below.

Provide and fix, 3 new metal lamps and 3- 10" opal shades.

E. Landing and other portions of Buildings.

Supply and fix 18 new switches, tighten up back blocks and adjust switch wires generally through building.

F. Upstairs rooms.

Supply and fit 5 new metal filament la,ps.

G. Ground Floor.

Supply and fit 2 metal filament lamps and 2- 10" opal shades.

Dear Sir,

I am advised to inform you that the Military forced an entrance into our buildings, 13 Lower Abbey Street; in Easter Week, and used them for some days during the Sinn Fein rebellion, and in so doing damaged the property to the amount of five or six pounds.

Three doors were badly damaged, also special locks and patent bolts.

Eight panes of heavy glass were broken.

Six electric lamps and some fittings were broken.

Also one large electric out-side lamp and globe.

I have approached the L.G.B. but they refer me to you, and we earnestly hope you will consider us in this matter and be pleased to make the damage good.

I await the favour of your kind reply, so that I may report the same to Headquarters London.
