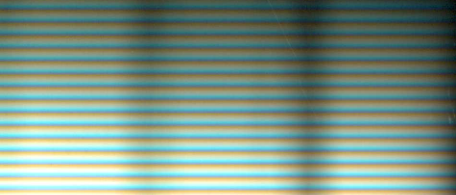

street I might not be uneasy about looting.

I am glad to say my premises
did escape with exception of the claims
enclosed, as far as I can trace.

1. J. V. Traynor & Co. There was no party from the District Dept occupying any premises in ~~St.~~ Great George Street.
2. Thomas Smith. I broke in to their shop myself it being a hardware shop & likely to contain arms & ammunition for which I had orders to search. I requisitioned the 2 Kindrick pots as cooking utensils for my men who were without any means of cooking. The spades I requisitioned to bury dead they were handed over to the Jewish St. Hospital authorities for that purpose. No notes were forced by me, and no men entered the premises after I left them. The other articles mentioned must have been removed after we had left Capel Street.
