I applied to the Military Authorities for Compensation for above loss and damage, and they reply that they cannot admit liability for losses arising out of the recent disturbances.

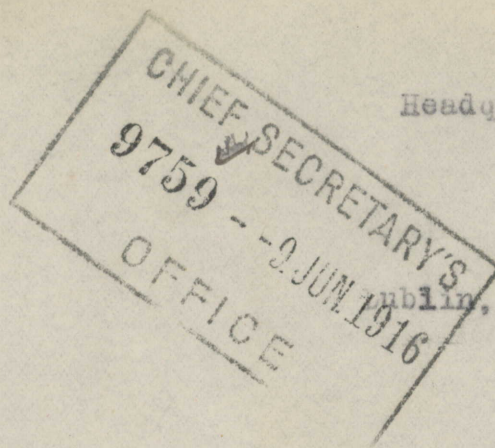

Dear Sir,

I am instructed by Mr. Owen White of 2 & 3 Lower Kevin Street, the Secretary of St. Kevin's Hall 116 & 117, Lower Clanbrassil Street, to apply to you for £8 compensation for damage done to St. Kevin's Hall between Saturday the 6th May and Sunday the 14th May 1916, when the Hall was occupied by the military! The Regiment he states was the Glanmorgans (query) which came from Malbough Barracks. He is not certain of the name of the regiment, but it was a Welsh regiment stationed at above barracks. He says the military took possession of the Hall from him and used the gas and electric light and they broke,

- wooden drum hoops,
- wooden music boxes,
- wooden music stands (belonging to the band),

and used them for firewood and burned the paper music. They also

choked the sewer and lavatory supply and after the military left, Mr. White, the Secretary, had to get the sewer cleared and place cleaned up. He estimates the damage by the billeting of the military at £3.

He states there was an advertisement in the paper a few days ago, asking for the claims to be sent in before the 7th inst., and it is in response to this advertisement that he has directed me to send you in his claim.
