




Dear Sir,

I am instructed by Mr. Owen White of 2 & 3 Lower Kevin Street, the Secretary of St. Kevin's Hall 116 & 117, Lower Clanbressil Street, to apply to you for £8 compensation for damage done to St. Kevin's Hall between Saturday the 6th May and Sunday the 14th May 1916, when the Hall was occupied by the military:

The Regiment he states was the Glanmorgans (query) which came from Malbouough Barracks. He is not certain of the name of the regiment, but it was a Welsh regiment stationed at above barracks. He says the military took possession of the Hall from him and used the gas and electric light and they broke,

wooden drum hoops,
wooden musix boxes,
wooden music stands (belonging to the band),

and used them for firewood and burned the paper music. They also
