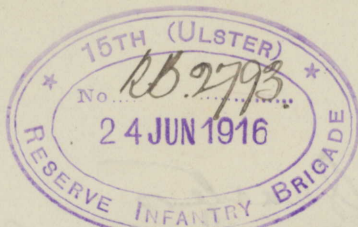

Sir,

I was acting Quarter Master Sergeant of the Detachment under Captain J.C.Douglas. I was with Captain Douglas the whole of the time of the Rebellion, and so far as I am aware the Signal Box was used by no one but Captain Douglas himself, and everyone else stopped on the Railway line; the only exception being that Captain Douglas allowed it to be used for cooking some of the men's food, but most of the food was cooked outside. I would furthermore like to state that the Signal box was not taken over by Captain Douglas, but as it was riddled by bullets, I am of opinion that Guard Whelan was afraid to stop there, and before the Military arrived his wife had vacated the place and was living elsewhere.

As regards to the damaged and the missing articles, I know nothing whatever about them, no damage having been done or any article having been taken away from the 26th to the evening of the 29th April, the time Captain Douglas was stationed there.
