Claim for Damages caused during the Disturbances on the
24th April, 1916, and following days.

I ~~We~~ *Agnes J. Martin* now residing
at *131, Strand Road, Sandymount* in the City of *Dublin*
do hereby solemnly and sincerely declare that on or about the *30th* day of *April*
1916, ~~damage was done to~~ the undermentioned Property, namely:—* *2 pair of*
Gold ear-rings (Pearls and Rubies) were taken from 21, Serpentine Avenue
and such damage was occasioned to the best of ^{my}~~our~~ belief by** *the Military*
who searched the house and in whose care the house was for several days
after the 30th.

so destroyed or damaged; that the Cost Price of same was as shown in each case;

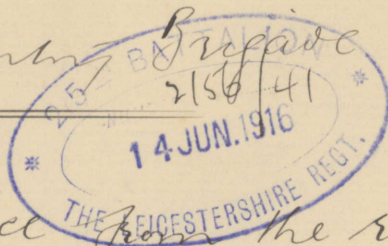
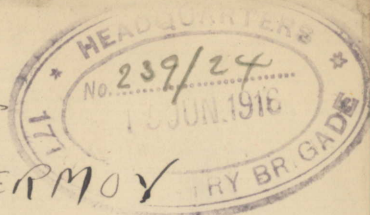

Sniping took place from the roof of houses in Serpentine Avenue as stated in Miss Martin's letter. The houses were searched and there was no one in No 21.

There is no record in this office of the actual men who searched ^{here} particular houses as the searches made were only for men or others inside the houses.

The company that did this work was B Coy, under the command of Capt. Jesson who has no knowledge of this.

German! There is no Col. Graham in this Battalion.

Firing took place again from the roof of these houses on the Sunday, when the naval gun opened fire on them, and Mills bombs were put through the roof of either No 21 or one near to it.

Avenue was, I believe, the 2nd Fifth
Leicesters. (They were
relieved on either Monday eve.
or Tuesday by the 2nd Fourths,
and the Jewellery was taken on
either Sunday night or Monday
morning, as I missed them
mid-day on Monday).

I am sorry I
can't give you the

name of officer in
charge, beyond that
Colonel Graham was
the gentleman who
took my Landlady
out of No 21, Serpentine
Avenue, immediately
after the firing on
Sunday night (30th Apr.)
as she was wounded.

Sir,

When the Rebellion
started in Dublin I
had been in the
Queens Co. on holiday,
and on my return to

town on the Wednesday
(26th April) I found
my room at No 7,
Serpentine Avenue had
been let to some men
who were in Dublin for
the Spring Show, and
who could not get
to their hotels in
town. I therefore took
a room at No 21,
Serpentine Avenue, for

a few days. On the
following Saturday
evening Jim Finn. Simpson
got ^{on the roof of} ~~into~~ these houses,
with the result that
the Terrace was fired
on by the Military
Machine Guns. The
houses were searched by
the Military apparently
on Monday (1st May) and

I had left a good pair of
Gold earrings (Pearls and
Rubies) on my dressing-
table at No 21, which
disappeared on that day.
They were in a small box,
and were all right on the
Sunday morn. I reported
this at the Military
Headquarters, Town Hall,
Ballinacorney, on Saturday
(13th) but have heard
nothing further. An action of your
advice. yours faithfully
(Miss) Agnes L. Martin.
