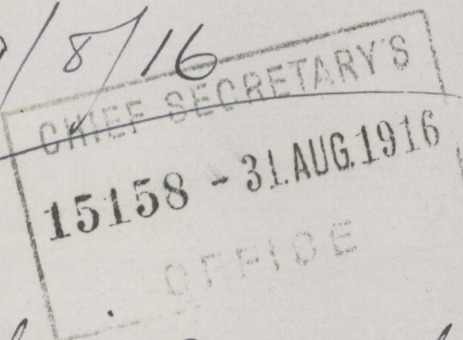

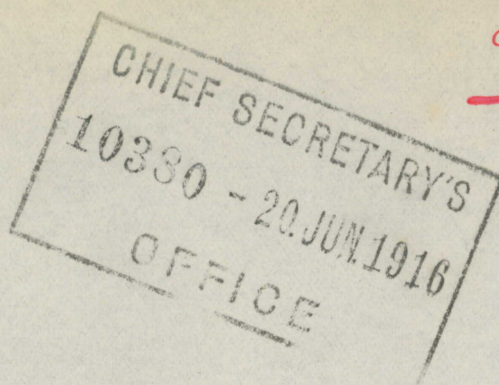

On the 2nd inst my house was visited by the Military & searched. After their departure I missed a curb chain gold bracelet - value £2.10-0. Again on 5th inst. it was visited by the Military, but on this

occasion the house was broken into, as myself & Sister the sole occupants of the house for the past 16 months were staying with friends. Being too terrified to stay at home, when we returned on Saturday morning we found the following articles missing a gold Kruger with h/c & ring value 12/6 a bunch of small gold binkets value 10/- & about 6 old silver coins value 5/- There was also a lock on a

Chest-broken which will
cost-4/- to repair. The total
value of all is £4-1-6

I wrote on the 9th inst-
to the Commanding Officer
Portobello Barracks giving
full particulars, but as yet-
no reply has reached me.
Myself & Sister are loyal Subjects
& have always been so & we both
feel much distressed & annoyed
being suspected of any disloyalty.
I am engaged at Messrs
W & C. Cornmarket where
I have held a position of
trust for nearly 40 years.

The Directors of the firm
will testify if necessary
I trust Sir you will
kindly entertain my claim
although the amount is
small it means a lot to me
& my Sister who are the
sufferers.
