

You will thus see that our account is one that should be dealt with by the Military Authorities.

We have been at great inconvenience in the matter and as our claim has been before you for a considerable time - nearly 5 weeks - we will thank you to let us know - when we may expect payment.

Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> April & Monday 1<sup>st</sup> May - Food supply committee took further supplies, as per requisitions left by Lieut Powell of 1<sup>st</sup> Leinster Regt.  
Tuesday morning 2<sup>nd</sup> May - Food Supplies taken away and signed for by Captain A. McDermott. R.D.F. We took stock of goods in store immediately afterwards.

Lieut. P. G. Coleman. 2/6 Staffs. was on duty in the neighbourhood during part of the time.

The Committee therefore proposes, after enquiry, as regards the Committee's liability, to return you these accounts which do not refer to us.

We are directed by Captain Kelly, of the Food Supplies Committee to send you the enclosed account for goods removed, or distributed by the Military, in addition to what were requisitioned by the Officer in charge of Food Supply party.

We have a perfect check on the quantity of goods taken as we "took stock" of all goods in our store on Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> April, (we may mention that we do this every Saturday) and we again took stock on Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> May, when we got possession of the premises.


I have ascertained that a certain amount of goods were removed from these premises and issued to the civil population.

At the time in question the arrangements for feeding the civil population had not been started. The people in this quarter were starving, and the Officers controlling this area issued the civil population with tinned goods taken from these premises. This ceased when the Food supplies Committee took over control.

The Military did not take any articles themselves, and everything was issued under the supervision of an Officer (8th Reserve Regiment of Cavalry).

No misconduct being alleged on the part of the Military, it would appear to be a case for the Civil Authorities.

I attach copy of a statement signed by one of the permanent Messengers at the Castle named Bond whom I sent down to Messrs O. & R. Fry to ascertain if the premises had been broken into.

His statement shows that before the Food Supply Committee took any action the premises were in the hands of the Military in the course of their duty in clearing the roofs of snipers.

I gave instructions that no premises were to be broken into as for the Committee. All goods taken for the Committee were properly requisitioned and a receipt was made out with the exact quantities taken.

Copies of these requisitions and receipts are in our possession. The Food Supply Committee is therefore refusing responsibility for any goods for which the owners do not possess the Committee's requisition and receipt.

I attach copy of a letter which I sent to Messrs O. & R. Fry and think that you may perhaps decide to alter your letter in view of this correspondence.

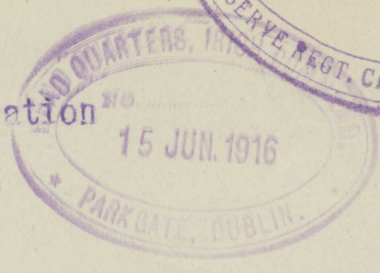
