Sir,

I regret that I am unable to furnish you with particulars of Unit & officers name for my family & self were refugees sheltering in Custom House during the time the military had possession. We left this house on Thursday 27th ulto. & returned on the following Tuesday. I was allowed a pass from the Custom House to above address on the Sunday (30th.) and the guns etc. had been taken then, so that if you could trace the Unit in occupation between Thursday night & Sunday it would simplify matters.

The following articles were taken from my house at above address during the time my family and self were sheltering in the Custom house from the recent trouble.

One D. B. 12 bore C. F. shot gun in mahogany case with accessories

One D. B. 12 bore Pin fire shot gun.

One cartridge belt containing 25, 12 bore shot cartridges.

12 bore ammunition to the extent of about 100 cartridge.

As I at present hold a license to have and use a gun and also held a peace preservation license in the days when the City and County were proclaimed, I wish to enquire if the government will be kind enough to return these articles?

Apologising for trespassing on your valuable time and trusting to be favoured with a satisfactory reply;
