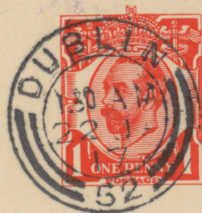

I, Patrick J. Smith beg to write you with reference to a claim supposed to have been sent in last May on behalf of Miss Cecilia Kelly of above address. The lady is a dressmaker earning an honest living and of all people in Dublin the poor girl who had to pay nearly for a week rent, and keep a house and pay workers and a servant could not afford to be at the loss occasioned during the Rebellion. She put in a claim for £15 last May, and I am glad to say that the delay is due through no fault of yours but through Mr. Bergin's (Solicitor, Rutland Sq) who only sent you in a notification of the damage done and food & food used by the military who occupied the house, and two blue forms were sent to him which he neglected to fill.

understand from your assistant
Mr Mason that the fault is
the Solicitors through not
filling the forms and he
advised me to apply for
forms.

We have taken the
case from Mr Bergin completely
and would feel grateful
if you would be good
enough to send me the
prescribed forms which
shall be filled at once
and duly signed. Sorry
for the trouble but
the poor lady has suffered
much by the delay and
is waiting on the money
to pay rent due which
you as a fair minded man
are bound to see she
deserves.

I am instructed by my Client, Miss Cecilia Kelly of 1 Talbot Street Dublin to inform you that on Thursday the 27th ulto. a military party comprising a Sergeant Major and 6 men of the Inniskilling Fusiliers took possession of her work, warerooms and bedrooms, which are situated over the premises of Mr. Thomas Linnane, Draper, on the corner of Talbot Street and Malborough Street. They used the premises for the purpose of carrying out certain military operations, and as a result, loss and damage to the value of £15 has occurred. All the locks and doors were forced; several of the mantelpieces were broken down for firewood; the beds were occupied by the troops, and the bed linen soiled and torn; the windows were smashed; delph was broken, and all the coal and food on the premises consumed; A golden bangle value £2.10. 0 and three pipes and cases and boot trees are missing.

I am putting this before you so that a grant - compassionate or otherwise - may be made to my Client who is a Dressmaker and not in very affluent circumstances.
