

Interests in the buildings

This house was taken possession of by the Nor Staffs Regiment. It appears that some of the water taps on the 2nd and 4th floors were allowed to overflow, thereby damaging the ceilings. The walls too were unintentionally scratched som what by bayonets carried on the shoulder. Claimant had no estimate prepared. After measu ing up the work a Contractor would carry out the actual repairs for about £10, but a further sum would require to be laid out as the place could be patched. I therefore suggest £20 as fair ar reasonable. Claimant has a fifteen years' repaing lease of the premises (eleven years to run) from Mrs. Kennedy, of 9 Adelaide Terrace, Kingst who has the building insured. Claimant is the proper person to carry out the repairs. He live on the premises and lets portion in flats. He is the Electrician at the Viceregal Lodge.

Sir,

I am instructed by Mr Richard Lewis of 1 Merrion Square Dublin to bring before the attention of the military Authorities his claim for compensation for damage sustained to his premises due to the occupation of same by the military for the period of over a week.

Mr Lewis occupies number 1 Merrion Square and portions of his house were set by him to certain persons who, on account of the continuous occupation of no less than five of the rooms of the house, were compelled to leave the premises and go elsewhere. In addition to the loss which my client has sustained from these sources his premises have been very badly wrecked, that is to say, the stairs etc., of the premises which he had recently done up in the very bast style.

His house was occupied by the North Staffordshire Regiment and subsequently by the Lincolnshire Regiment and during this time a guard of twelve men, which was changed every four hours, was continuously kept in the house which was commandeered by a Captain in the North Staffordshire Regiment on the Wednesday after Easter. Under these circumstances my chient instructs me to ask you to put forward his claim for \$70. compensation for the loss sustained by him and the consequential damage.
