Interests in the buildings

The blind was badly damaged by bullet marks, but was in use two years and shows great signs of mildew. Claimant is only entitled to its value at the time of outbreak, which I put down as 18/-.

In regard to the Glass claim, it is insured against breakage, with a clause that the policy "does not extend to cover breakages arising directly or indirectly out of or consequent upon war operations".

Claimant in the first instance notified the "London & Lancashire, and claim form was issued which he duly completed and returned. Their reply was "You will no doubt have learned that the Government now assume responsibility for the damage"; in other words, they are indirectly inferring that they are not liable. Personally, if the Committee refuse to pay, I have not the slightest hesitation in saying that the Insurance Co. will not see Claimant at a loss. If the Committee decide to make payment the estimate of £8. 11. 1. is reasonable - less 2½%, and Brooks Thomas have promised Buildings allow salvage, which I write down at 25/-, so that the amount of Glass item is £7. 1. 9.
