Sir,

I am directed by the Property Losses Committee to refer to Claim No. 269, Laurence Freeley, £34. 13. 3, included in the 4th Schedule of Recommendations, page 52, and to say that the claim included an item for a watch left for repairs, for which Mr Freeley was liable. Mr Freeley's valuation of this watch seemed a fair and reasonable one and was accepted as such by the Committee's Inspector and by the Committee. However, when Mr Freeley came later to settle with the owner, the latter's claim was £2. 18. 0 less than the valuation, and Mr Freeley has now forwarded a cheque for the sum of £2. 18. 0, which is transmitted herewith.


