This wanton act did not arise out of the rebellion but was done when it was quelled and things were becoming normal. At an ordinary time compensation would be levied off the city rates but as the Police had not returned to duty at time of the occurrence the question as to who should pay compensation is one I cannot answer. do hereby solemnly and sincerely declare that on or about the 2nd day of May, 1916, damage was done to the undermentioned Property, namely: \* the plate glass window of the shop of 165 Church St., aforesaid was maliciously and wantonly broken & destroyed

and such damage was occasioned to the best of my belief by\*\* a brick being thrown through the window.

And I further declare that the Property and Articles specified on the other side were so destroyed or damaged; that the Cost Price of same was as shown in each case; that at the time of the destruction or damage they were respectively of the Values specified under the head "Value of Property at time of Destruction or Damage"; and that, in consequence of such destruction or damage, claim is hereby made for the sums specified under the head "Amount Claimed"; that the Claim is made by me as† Owner; and that no person is interested in the said property except‡ myself

and that it is not insured by me or any other person, § except as follows, namely:— Norwich Union Company, Policy No. 566567, Amount £

And I make this solemn Declaration conscientiously believing the same to be true, and by virtue of the provisions of the Statutory Declarations Act, 1835.
