Although I have written three times to this Claimant I have failed to get a response. However, I have obtained sufficient particulars from Messrs. J. J. Kelly & Company, who sold the machine, to estimate its probable value. He paid them cash £36. 10. 0. in the end of January for the Bicycle, and he gave it a fair amount of wear for three months while in training on the Curragh. They estimate its value at in or about £30, and I recommend this amount.


