





Every difference arising out of this Policy shall be referred to a single Arbitrator under and subject to the Provisions of the Arbitration Act, 1889, or if the claimant reside in Scotland then under the Arbitration (Scotland) Act, 1894, or if in Ireland under the Common Law Procedure Act. And it is hereby expressly stipulated and declared that the obtaining of an Award by such Arbitrator shall be a condition precedent to the liability of the Society to pay any claim in respect of which any such difference may have arisen.

THIS Insurance is renewed on the express condition that the Society shall not be liable for any breakage occasioned directly or indirectly by the act of Foreign Enemies or of any Military or usurped Power.

N.B.—In the event of any Breakage, notice thereof must be given immediately to the Society.


