In reply to yours dated 23rd inst this claim was not accurately presented. A certain discount was deducted by us from the invoices furnished which Claimants had set off against the charges. These we did not include as they were not separately shewn. We have now received a complete and proper statement of the loss shewing an increase of 7s. 6d over the original claim, the total now being £135. 1. 0 as amended- against £134. 13. 6 claimed.

The deduction we made in our Award was due to the items of claim being made out in a different way from the invoices and including charges not shewn in the invoices.

In accordance with your request as per 'phone conversation last Saturday, we are submitting particulars of our claim for Sugar looted from the British & Irish Company's Stores in the form prescribed by you. This increases the amount of our claim by 7/6, and is accounted for by our explanation to you on Saturday, that in the first instance the amount included for Insurance was taken from an entry in our Stock Book prior to the Rebellion, which only contains the approximate cost of Insurance, being a charge that is constantly changing. The figures now submitted are the actual amounts paid out by us, and as they are included along with various other transactions we cannot send you the documents, but would be pleased to let your Representative inspect them if he calls here at any time.

Dear Sir,

Referring to our claim for £134.13.6 for 57 cases Cubes Sugar looted from the British & Irish Stores, against which we have received a Paying Order for £130. 5. 2. As the quantity lost has been admitted, and the price charged being the actual cost of the Sugar (invoice was produced) we would be glad to know why any deduction has been made. We had another claim for Sugar looted from Messrs. Tedcastle Stores, which was paid in full, and cannot understand why there should be any differentiation in the settlement of the claims.

We think it only fair to you personally, and the position you occupy in respect of this matter, to give you an opportunity of investigating the circumstances; as we do not intend accepting any amount less than what is due, ~~to us~~, and resent the attempt that has been made to inflict this wrong on us.

One of our Directors called last week, and as no explanation whatever was forthcoming from the gentleman whom he interviewed in Mr. Healy's absence, against whom we do not attack any blame, the Paying Order was refused and left behind.


