re. Claim No. 2613 - Henry Stauber, late Waiter Metropole Hotel.

With reference to your letter of the 24th inst., on this subject, I have made careful inquiries and have ascertained that Stauber is believed to be an Austrian. He is not <sup>now</sup> or never has been interned. I interviewed him personally and he did not then appear to me to be a foreigner. I understand he has resided in this country for some 30 years and has had considerable service as a Waiter including the Shelbourne Hotel. Although an Austrian, he has never, so far as I can ascertain, exhibited any tendency to side with the enemy.
