Joseph Murray has a stable in Percy Lane off Percy Place, and the firing ceased for a time on Wednesday the 26th April. Murray yoked his mare between 12 o'clock and one o'clock and went to Swans off Westland Row to get feeding for the mare. He was returning up Mount Street to get to Stable when a Skirmish took place about Mount St. Bridge and Murray was unable to go up Mount Street. He waited outside his sister's place in Powerscourt until between four and five o'clock in the evening, and then ascertained that it was impossible to get to his stable in Percy Lane. He met a Mr Daly who told him his (Daly's) sister had a stable in 11 Grattan Court (off Mount St) and Murray could put his mare there. Murray put the Mare in Daly's stable, and returned to Powerscourt, but place became so hot, bullets having been fired through the windows, that he went out to Kingstown, and could not get back to town until the Wednesday following. He went to Daly's stable the moment he arrived in town, and took out the Mare which staggered as it was led out. He then brought the mare home to his own stable and it died on Thursday morning.

Murray paid £12 for the Mare and had her about nine months.
