re: CLAIM FOR DAMAGES CAUSED DURING THE DISTURBANCES ON THE 24TH APRIL, 1916 AND FOLLOWING DAYS.

I, VALENTINE MURPHY of Market Square, Enniscorthy in the County of Wexford, Draper, Make Oath and say as follows

1. At the time of the Rebellion here a quantity of goods was commandeered from me by the parties participating in the Rising amongst which goods was an item for shirts amounting to £23. 9. 0, as set out in the Claim Form and on which Form marked with the letter "A" I have endorsed my name previous to the swearing hereof and to which I beg to refer.

2. In the course of a conversation which took place between myself and Daniel Jordan merchant of this town, after the Rising had been put down, I informed him that some goods had been commandeered by Rebels amongst whom was his Son. He asked me what items they were and I informed him there was an item for shirts amounting to £23. 9. 0. Mr. Jordan then said that he would not see me at any loss as his son had been concerned in the commandeering of these goods and there and then he gave me a Cheque for the amount on the understanding that if I succeeded in recovering same I would refund it to him.

3. At the time I was not aware of any likelihood of these goods being paid for by the Government and consequently when I filled up the Claim Form which was sent to me I omitted to include this item, and it was not until I received the Draft from the Property Losses (Ireland) Committee that I informed Mr. Jordan of the fact.

4. I have now refunded to Mr. Jordan this amount and enclose a further form of Declaration setting out this item which I have not been compensated for and which amount I say is due to me.

5. At the request of Mr. Jordan I am making the
