COUNTY WEXFORD.
MOTOR CAR WRECKED BY REBELS.
(FROM OUR CORRESPONDENT.)

WEXFORD, THURSDAY.

An interesting point regarding the compensation of property owners in the provinces who suffered loss during the *Sinn Fein* disturbances was raised at Wexford Assizes during the hearing of an appeal by Mr. Justice Kenny, in which the County Council sought to have the decision of County Court Judge Barry, in awarding £100 damages to Mr. E. McAleavey, Enniscorthy, for the alleged malicious injury of his premises and motor car, reversed.

Mr. Lupton (instructed by Mr. R. W. Elgee, solicitor), who appeared for the appellants, said as he understood that it was intended to introduce legislation dealing with the compensation of property owners who suffered loss during the recent rebellion, he desired to have the hearing of the appeal adjourned.

Mr. Swayne (instructed by Mr. B. J. O'Flaherty, solicitor), for the respondent, explained that during the *Sinn Fein* rising in Enniscorthy the rebels took possession of his client's premises, where they did some damage. When Mr. McAleavey got back his motor car, which had been commandeered, it was completely wrecked. As he had got the decree, he had no objection to the adjournment.

His Lordship, in adjourning the case, said that but for Mr. Swayne's consent he would not think of adjourning the action, as he did not like leaving work for his successor at the next Assizes.
