Claim No. 2733.

Name of Claimant William Ireland. Occupation Grocer & Provision Merchant.

Situation of Property between Dundalk and Dublin.

This Claimant was stopped in his motor car (15 h.p. Clement Talbot) a little outside Dundalk on 24th April 1916, by a party of Rebels who deliberately damaged beyond repair the four tyres on the car and the one spare tyre, taking away the two Rugs in the car. The tyres destroyed were Dunlop's and cost in or about the same figure as the replaced tyres put on by Leavy of Dundalk at a cost of £33. 4. 3. Allowing for some slight depreciation in the Dunlop tyres which had not been used for any length of time I put the actual damage Claimant suffered at about £30. The "Liverpool & London & Globe" with which the motor car is insured denied liability in this matter.
