

The claimants' solicitors have been informed that the Military Authorities cannot accept any responsibility, but I am referring the claims to you as the Civil Authority, and propose to adopt this course with regard to future claims, in view of the possibility of a Board of Assessment being assembled hereafter under your Office.

Re death of Mr Thomas Hickey and his son Christopher Hickey of 168 North King Street.

Dear Sir,

You will recollect that our Mr Russell's interview with you, you suggested that we should obtain a description of the watches worn by the two deceased parties. We have now ascertained that the boy Christopher Hickey had a gun-metal watch of ordinary size, and Mr Thomas Hickey wore a plain silver Hunter Watch. Neither of these watches were on the bodies when they were found.

Referring to your letter of the 2nd inst., in which you stated that the matter had passed to the Civil Authorities, we woote to the Under Secretary asking him to let us know, when the matter would be looked into; but we have not heard anything since, we would be glad to know when matters of this nature which are passed on by you, will be attended to.
