lost during the Rebellion in Ireland.

In April 1916, I sent my claim of 11/6
in to Mrs. Hartley & Co. first, they referred
me to you. I wrote to you on June 10th.
You replied on June 12th that I am
to forward to you a subscription of
10/- in order to recover the amount of
11/6 claimed by me for shorts.

I did not consider this business at all so
instead of answering you, I asked Mrs.
Hartley & Co. to pay up the 11/6.

This morning I rec^d. the enclosed notice

from them, asking me again to apply to you.

Well I am not going to pay 10/- for things that do not concern me & shall thank you to forward the amount of my small claim of 11/6 without any further delay.

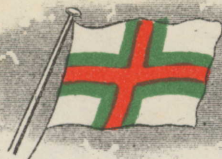

During the rebellion in Ireland our Dublin stores were broken into, and many goods were looted and damaged. It is difficult to give definite information on the subject, but apparently your shipments, as per particulars at foot, were looted by the rioters.

The Government, we anticipate, will make some recompense to the cargo owners. Will you please therefore send your claim to Mr. R. J. Kidney (Secretary) Dublin Fire & Property Losses Association 1916, 12 College Green, Dublin. This Association has been formed to look after the interests of all concerned.
