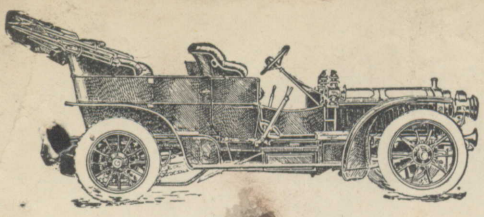
Dear Sir:- *II Put under al. 9/12*

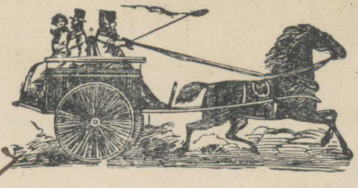

Remarks: I found on investigation that the claimant sustained greater damage than is shown on the Claim Form, and he omitted to include such items as 2 Cushions, 2 Head lamps, 2 Rugs and oilcloth which were looted. I consider, in the circumstances, that £9.10/- would be fair and reasonable compensation.

When I visited the claimant, I found him in a semi state of unconsciousness following an acute attack of Bronchitis, contracted during the Rebellion, and he is not expected to now survive it. Compensation might be made payable to his wife - Jane Kelly.
