Moyode Castle Estate of Rt. Hon. Lady Ardilaun

Dear Sir,

During the recent rebellion a party of some 900 rebels visited Moyode Castle, they entered into possession of same on Wednesday the 26th April and remained in occupation up to and including the following Friday. They took and carried away and converted to their own use garden produce value £3 also certain tools viz;- 2 axes and 1 garden syringe value £1. 2. 6 making a total of £4. 2. 6 and on behalf of Lady Ardilaun we beg to claim therefor.

The rebels also took a considerable quantity of goods belonging of Lady Ardilaun's gardener a man named John Shekleton but we understand he has preferred a claim through the local police authorities

The forms which you sent us for particulars of claim in another case does not appear to be suitable to the above mentioned perhaps this letter will be sufficient for your purposes.
