Interests in the buildings
The lease of house is in the name of claimant's mother who assigns him in his work. Mrs Kavanagh wishes the claim to remain in her son's name.

The largest item of claim is damage to roof £14 caused by concussion. The roof is at least 100 years old & it is difficult to say whether or not it was in its present condition before the firing of the gun. It is possible for the concussion to cause the damage claimed. It certainly may have done some of the damage. I have therefore included in my recommendation £7 half the amount of estimate which I think would be fair. I carefully went into all the items of claim and consider the sum of £33.6.10 fair & reasonable.

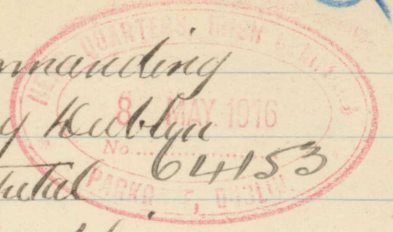

my cream crocks were broken. Butter and other goods
were blown about some of my furniture was made
smash of cream for churning purposes were also
blown about my shop in fact I have met with
a great loss in my brewing room and other of the
apartments by me were made wreck of I am a
man do my very best to rear my family in a poor
respectable manner as a father should do. And
I implore your General through your kindness to
do something for me as I leave my trust in your
honour and you will have my constant prayers
