With regard to the damage done to Mr. Bluff Duncan's property, during the Rebellion. I have examined all the houses, & calculate the damage done, at not less than £10. Glass & materials are at a very high price. I append particulars of the harm done to the different houses.

No. 60 Railway St.	9 panes glass, walls &c. damaged, paper too, with bullets.
61 "	10 panes glass, same as above.
62 "	8 " " "
2 Preston St.	1 " " "
7 2 nd Buckingham St.	Heavy lead gutter, damaged with shot &c.

Of course, all these rooms will have to be plastered up & papered. Not one single tenant was belonging to any one of these rebel organisations.
