Agentleman, named Turner, now an officer in a Flying corps, was propietos of the school. My boy had got only about half way Through his course. The fee and his support cost me £25, which bons been lost, as I cannot afford to send him to another school, and he must turn to something else. Turner, of lourse, will be making a claim, and if the Government eventually Consider Consequential losses, this class of loss might come within the limit's of that Consideration. I would bevery thankful of you would Hindly afford me any information that would assist me in fulting forward my claim in the event of the Gov! taking a generous view of losses beyond the actual damage to property.
