Iam satisfied that none of the articles are in possession of the men in this Battalion.

Besides the usual weekly kit inspections, I held a muster parade of the Battalion shortly after leaving Kingsbridge Station, at which every article in possession

of the men was inspected.

I would point out that other troops were in occupation of the Station before my arrival with the 2/5th Sherwood Foresters on the 27th April, and after my departure on the 5th May. There were detachments of Reserve Cavalry, Dublin Fusiliers, Irish Rifles, R.A.M.C. &c. in the Station between the above dates.
