



There were some blankets in the ground floor room to left of entrance, No. 6 T.C.D. when this Brigade first occupied that room, and were still there when we left. Possibly these were the property of Dr. White.

To the Asst Provost Marshal.

Dear Sir

If I am in error in addressing  
this letter to you, would you kindly for-  
ward it to the proper authorities.

I am a professor in Trinity College;  
my rooms look out on College Green;  
consequently I was directed to leave them  
open for military purposes. My rooms  
was open - doors never shut - from April  
25<sup>th</sup> for at least a fortnight. Soldiers  
were in & out all the time, and two officers  
of the S. Stafford Regt slept in them.  
I have no complaint to make of their  
behaviour; but when they had gone, I  
found that all my coal had been taken  
away, a bucket, a clothes brush, my  
towels & dusters, I believe I also lost  
pillows & blankets, but this I could  
not swear to.

The Junior Dean  
submitted a claim for me of £1. to  
the Board; but I have been told by them  
to apply directly to the military authorities.
