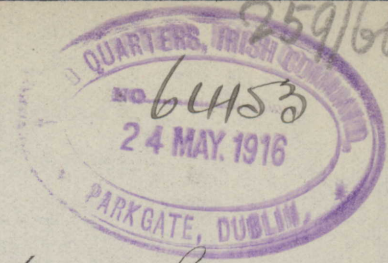

We thank you for your favour of the 15th inst., (64153.) Q. and in reply beg to palce the following facts before you.

On Thursday 27th April, some Officers, and men of the "Innis-killing" Regt. visited these premises about 11 a.m. There being no caretaker they inquired from ,Dublin Typographical Society whose prem-ises are next door, and received full information, but insisted on searching the house. They effected an entrance through the Society's house at the back and made a thorough search, in which they must have found abundant evidence of loyalty, as we are storing free numerous articles of kit and stocks of Wines etc. for units at present with the British Expeditionary Force.

Next morning at 5 a.m. the Officers and men of the same Regt. returned and remained 1½ hours during which time they removed a quant-ity of Wine.

On the following day, Saturday, some of the R. Irish Fusiliers, who had no comissioned Officer in charge, removed some Berncastle Doctor in a sack, which we doubt if they appreciated.

We would not have objected in the least to the Officers and men taking what they would reasonably require as refreshment, or had
