Remarks

I visited Malachide today, and from investigation found that the Dray was despatched on the 26<sup>th</sup> April last, under charge of Claimant's man, from Malachide to Skerris for a load of stone, and when it reached its destination it was commandeered by the R. I. C. acting under military instructions for the purpose of a barricade for defence purposes. In being so used, it was damaged to the extent of £4. 10/- and is still unusable.
