

During the recent disturbances in Dublin and while the Military were in occupation of the station four bicycles were requisitioned from our Cloakroom for Military purposes.

Three on April 29th and
One on April 30th.

Two of these bicycles have been recovered but the other two are still missing. They are described as under :-

- (A) A Sparkbrook Grand Roadster enamelled dark brown No 10395.
 Brakes - Two Sparkbrook Roller levers.
 Tyres - Dunlop Roadster 28 X 1 1/2 ins.
 Saddle - Brooks B 95 plated,
 Gear - B.S.A. three-speed 54. 72. 94.
 Gear Case - Sparkbrook detached oil-tight case with nickel-plated brass disc.
 Accessories - Luggage carrier, inflator, Tool-bag & Tools (Claim £15.5)
- (B) A "Kelly Special" Number C15570 with gear case, three-speed gear, Brooks Saddle, Blue Cloth Saddle cover, Rim brakes, Dunlop Tyres.

Careful enquiries have been made but I regret for so far without success. One of the owners has lodged a claim against the Company for £15.15.0, and no doubt we shall receive a specific claim for the other should it not turn up soon.

Kindly have the matter submitted, with a view to compensating the owners for their loss.
