Dear Sir,

over in this case within the next few days
I am instructed by my Client, Mr. Patrick J. Moore to put the following facts before you, in reference to his claim for compensation, with a view to your expediting payment to him, or at least a payment on account. My Client is not a man in very affluent circumstances, and is crippled to a great extent by the damage done to his stock etc. The injured cabs set out in the claim form were used by my Client for the purpose of hiring out to Cab Owners when leaving their vehicles with him for repairs. The damage done to them has rendered them absolutely useless, and he has now no cabs for hiring purposes, and as Cab owners will not leave their vehicles for repairs unless they get one ~~for~~ to use temporarily, they have taken their work elsewhere, and the loss is a serious one to my Client. As regards the rest of the stock in trade, he has had to replace same, as well as paying for what was damaged and looted.

Under these circumstances I feel sure you will agree that his case is one which ought to be dealt with expeditiously, at least by a payment on account to tide him over the difficulties, and I express the hope that you will give the matter your early and favourable consideration.
