Interests in the buildings

About 1 p.m. on Easter Monday, 24th April, Claimant was passing the General Post Office when he was stopped by the Rebels. The Bicycle was wheeled into the Post Office, and perished in the destruction. The remains were subsequently removed but there was no salvage. Invoice is attached showing the actual cost of the Motor Cycle and Lamp at £32. 2. 0. Sufficient has not however been allowed for depreciation, the Bicycle having been in use, and experts put the value of same at £22.
