Name of Claimant Gavagan. Miss E. Propr: Occupation Lodging House.

Situation of Property 7 Farrell's Lane, Dublin.

I view this Claim with a certain amount of suspicion. Three men, including Claimant's brother-in-law, P. Smullen, were arrested by the Military and taken to England. P. Smullen was released a month later. Sinn Fein ammunition and accoutrements were found on the premises. At the present moment there is a Piano & a Hall Clock there, both of good quality, and entirely out of keeping with surroundings - (those of a 3rd rate common lodging house.) The claim is grossly overstated.
