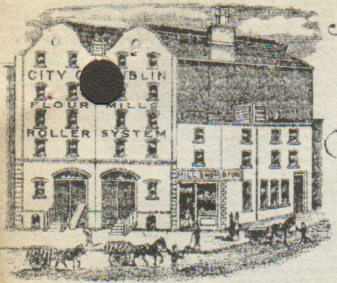

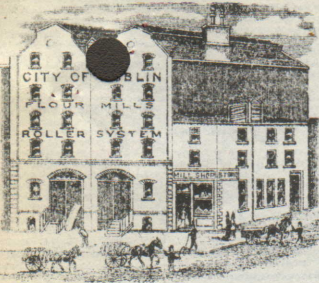
Dear Sir

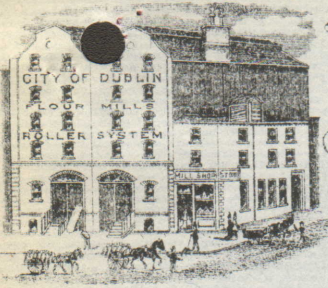

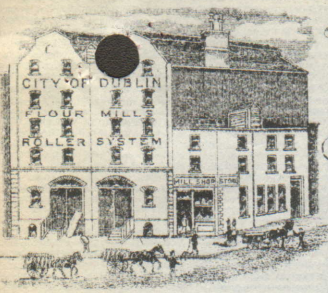

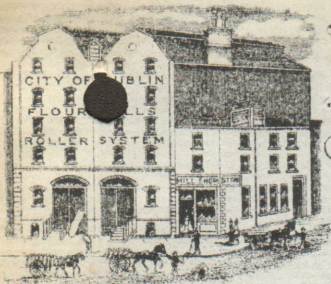
