



There were in all 7 trunks containing wearing apparel, jewellery and other articles which were looted on Saturday the 29th April 1916. The wearing apparel was purchased in Messrs Gimbels, 6th Avenue, and 33rd Street New York and Messrs O'Neills 3rd Avenue, New York. The jewellery was purchased in Messrs Bowles, Boston and Messrs Blackstar & Frosts; 5th Avenue, New York. The watch was purchased about 20 years ago for 50 Dollars.
