
Dear Sir,



Dear Sir,

I re-furnished to the Chief Secretary for Ireland an account for £66. 11. 0 in respect of the Company's cash looted during the recent troubles, and have to-day received an intimation from him that the account has been forwarded to your Committee, to whom I should address further communication. As already stated, the figures are perfectly bona fide, and if you consider it necessary, I shall have pleasure in facilitating you by arranging for an inspection of the Company's books to substantiate the claim.

As already mentioned, the principal amount, viz:- £64.1.11 was taken by an armed force who. on Easter Monday, entered the Booking Office after the morning main line train had left, drove out the Booking Clerks, and remained in possession until the Military occupied the premises on the following day. The claim, as your Committee will see, arises from a cause quite different from most of the claims for loss of cash, and in view of this, and in consideration of the invaluable service rendered by my Company during the recent troubles, my Directors feel confident that a full and early settlement of this claim can be recommended by your Committee.

With reference to the cheque for £731 received in settlement of my Company's claim for £834. 14. 7 in respect of looting of cash and property, and damage to the latter, our Traffic Manager informs me that he has ascertained from your Department that a deduction of £66. 11. 0, representing losses of Cash looted from the Booking Offices, etc., has been made. These items are absolutely bona fide, as the Company's account books show, and with regard to the item of £64. 1. 11 taken from Harcourt Street Booking Office on Easter Monday, it is fully established that the looting took place by an armed force who drove out the Booking Clerks.

Under these circumstances my Directors desire me to re-furnish you with an account for these items, and to request you kindly to give the matter your consideration, after which they have no doubt that you will have no difficulty in making settlement.
