Dear Sir,

I would feel obliged if you would kindly expedite the above claim, and let me know how the matter stands. Your Assessor interviewed me and saw the machine about a month ago. I have been forced for the past couple of years to supplement my income by supplying music for Dance parties, Concerts etc., and have a considerable number of Clients in the Country, to mention a few, Dundalk, Carrickmacross, Rahans, Athy, Mullingar etc. To enable me to play in any Town at night and be in my place of business the next morning I had to purchase the Motor Bicycle, and it was a valuable asset to me in this way, as no trains suitable to me reach Dublin before 10.30 - 11 o'clock, at which hour I must be in my place of business here, and you can see therefore that without the aid of the machine I could not undertake this work. I am now receiving bookings from several of these Towns,



and I cannot afford to let them slip. It is therefore a serious matter to me if my machine was not available for the beginning of next month; and it is a more serious thing still to a poor man like myself to have my machine unsaleable by reason of the damage to it.

In apologising for trespassing on your valuable time may I express the hope that you will deal expeditiously with the matter and much oblige.

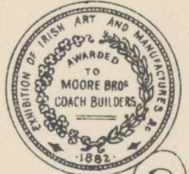
